

Certificate of Compliance California Proposition 65


Prop 65 is a California voter initiative designed to protect citizens and sources of drinking water from harmful chemicals.

The US State is required to maintain and publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. The list is administered by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) <https://oehha.ca.gov/> and is updated at least once a year.

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that are known to cause cancer or birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be by-products of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

First published in 1986, the list now includes approximately 900 chemicals and the current list is published on the OEHHA website <https://oehha.ca.gov/proposition-65/proposition-65-list>
